

Hide Me Find Me

A good warm up or language based activity to get children noticing what is around them and thinking of information that comes to them through their senses.



You will need:

- wood or card discs, or pebbles one per child
- sharpie or similar pens
- an area where there are different 'views' and hiding places

What to do:

1. Each participant draws on their disc or pebble a woodland creature. (Alternatively, this activity can be done using a single woodland character instead eg a soft toy squirrel/bee and so skip this stage.)
2. One child hides their disc or the character somewhere in the chosen area while the others are turned the other way and not peeping!! The hider must take note of what is around so they can describe its location without looking again.
3. Once the hider is back the others question to find out clues as to its whereabouts. What can it see/hear/smell/feel from where it is? The hider must be very careful not to look at where it is and so give it away!
4. Once a few clues have been discovered to narrow down its location the searchers can go and find it.
5. Repeat with a different hider.
